provide for the items purchased by LCCF team members; thus the inmates will still get a gift bag (thermal undershirt, shampoo, deodorant and a pair of white socks).

Mt. Gretna UMC Disabilities Ministry

During the first quarter of 2020, I submitted a proposal requesting the establishment of a new "Disabilities Ministry" within the Mt. Gretna UMC. After an initial review by Pastor Mike Remel the proposal was introduced to the Administrative Committee. Subsequently, the Administrative Committee endorsed the proposal and gave the go-ahead to proceed.

With an initial offering and a matching amount from the endowment fund the new Disability Ministry is now officially in business.

The disability ministry will focus on disabled youth, young adults, and older adults requiring assistance within the Lebanon County area. Assistance in the form of prosthetic devices, visual enhancement devices, or rehabilitative services may be awarded to those in need. Of course, there are many other individual needs and each one will be identified, evaluated, and considered for a possible award.

More specifically, recipients and the award amounts will be determined on a case by case basis. The Disability Ministry's services are also available to members of the Mt. Gretna UMC congregation, their immediate families, and extended family members currently living in Lebanon County.

There will be a strict adherence to confidentiality. Both Pastor Remel and Randy Swope may be contacted with an inquiry at any time with a phone call or email. The contact information is listed below. Email inquiries will receive an acknowledgement of receipt but no personal information shall be discussed, transmitted, or responded to by email in the interest of personal confidentiality. Person to person inquiries and meetings can be arranged with either Pastor Mike Remel, myself, or both of us to discuss the type of assistance required. In addition, phone calls are acceptable, expedient, and will be guarded with the upmost confidentiality.

The Disabilities Ministry is pleased to announce their first award; which occurred in November 2020. The Lancaster/Lebanon Vision Corps partnered with the Disability Ministry, in order to enable a youngster, one of their clients, to receive the first award.

An 8<sup>th</sup> grade student with a degenerative visual impairment will receive a digital reading device and face shield that will improve her ability to read at school and do her homework. What was the initial result? After trying on the face shield for the very first time the individual literally beamed over her immediate improvement reading printed material.

The Mt. Gretna UMC congregation can remain confident that we will continue to assist this youngster throughout her academic career. Finally, we should all share in her success today and hopefully, throughout her entire life.
