#### **Disability Ministry Update 2021**

The Disability Ministries most recent award on May 12, 2021, provided Pat, the recipient, with a handheld digital imaging reader. She had completely lost her ability to read any printed material. Surgery was not an option, eyeglasses ineffective, and other types of magnification devices unsatisfactory. Lebanon Vision Corps once again, partnered with the Mt. Gretna UMC Disability Ministry. The digital imaging device was delivered to Pat in less than two weeks after Vision Corps recommended the correct prosthetic required to improve Pat's vision.
