MGUMC To Go Solar

At the January 15 meeting, MGUMC

Administrative Council voted to move forward with installation of solar panels on the church roof. The initial cost of installation is about \$30,000 which will include solar panels and permitting. It is anticipated that the panel will produce more electricity than what the church needs, and surplus electricity will be sold to the grid at the end of the year.

This project was made possible by the generous gift of \$50,000 from the estate of the father of one of our members who has chosen to remain anonymous. Because donations like this are the responsibility of Trustees, they established an Ad Hoc Committee to discern how best to allocate these funds. That committee voted in December to proceed with the solar project as initially proposed in October 2024. Trustees approved the project and brought it to Administrative Council.

The expectation is that after several months, MGUMC will receive a rebate of about \$9,000 from the Federal Solar Tax Credit. Chris Sides will be the project lead.

The Ad Hoc Committee will continue prayerful consideration of the remainder of the funds.
